Summer Reading: Read Beyond the Beaten Path



Summer Reading for Kids:

Mark your reading log for each day that you read. You can read for as long as you would like. The days do not need to be in a row. What kind of books count? Physical books, eBooks, and audiobooks. After 20 days of reading, you are halfway through the program! Bring your log to Youth Services to earn a prize and raffle entry. Prize pick-up begins Monday, June 27, 2022.

After 40 days of reading, you have completed the program! Come back to Youth Services any day between July 25th and August 22nd to receive your final prize and raffle entry. Your reading log must be received by Monday, August 22, 2022 to collect prizes.

Prizes are available to children from birth through high school. Ask for your summer reading log today!

When you check out a book you will receive a raffle entry for a gift card. The more you read, the more entries you will get. Read more and improve your odds of winning! Daughters of the Script Book Group






